



STUDENT DISCLOSURE

On December 12, 2016 the U S Department of Education announced their final decision to remove federal recognition of the Accrediting Council of Independent Colleges and Schools (ACICS) Accrediting Agency. All Schools accredited by ACICS have been given an 18-month time frame through June 12 2018 to find a new accrediting agency to maintain eligibility to receive funds under Title IV, HEA programs. If Schiller International University does not obtain accreditation within the 18 month period, then Schiller International University would no longer be eligible to receive funds under the Title IV, HEA programs. Schiller International University will be under the direct supervision of the U S Department of Education which deems the institution to hold recognized accreditation and students will remain under the Federal Student Aid Program during the 18 months.

In anticipating this decision Schiller International University has been actively working with other federally recognized Accrediting Agencies and expects to complete the process within the 18-month time frame.

Any Schiller International University student who has a complaint relating to Title IV eligibility or administration, the quality of education received at the Schiller International University, or otherwise relating to the accreditation standards of its former accrediting agency can submit that complaint to the following:
